Dear Dr. Gordon:

I am sending you ^{two} complete sets of galley proofs of "The Minor Cemetery at Giza" - Fisher, 1 to 52 inclusive. We have left space for the insertion of the hieroglyphics. What I would suggest would be that after he reads the galley proofs according to the manuscript that he cuts the hieroglyphics from same and paste them in their proper places on the galley proofs, numbering same, and then there can be no possible way of the compositor making a mistake.
