

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 1

NB I (McF), pp.8 ff.

31 March-5 April 1952

Dug Trench 1 to depth of - all appears to have been an intrusive pit, the fill being quite the same throughout - sandy soil mixed with patches of darker surface soil and bits of chavara averaging walnut and fist size. Few stones but some up to foot size. See Film 166-13. Handful of sherds - Geometric and Bucchero. No other finds. The rock is sometimes ammovracho and sometimes chavara - stratified thus. Dug down to bedrock. The intrusive pit was sunk into rock. It was so soft that rifler failed to realize that it was rock.

TRENCH 2

31 March-5 April 1952

Dug Trench 2, SW branch to depth of and NE branch to depth of and SE branch to depth of . Fill all same as in Trench 1, all fill of intrusive pits but pottery only from SW pit. About one-fifth bucket of sherds - Geometric - bowl, kylix and other frags. The soil in these intrusive pits was somewhat sandier than in Trench 1. See Film 166-14 and 15. Dug to bedrock in all branches. The tomb riflers sank their pits into the rock as they did in Trench 1.

TRENCH 3

31 March-5 April 1952

Dug Trench 3 to depth of . See Film 166-16. The soil here was found undisturbed - very sandy soil - all the same. Dug down to bedrock of ammo-chavara. No sherds. 3 rough stones about bucket size - very few other stones.

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 4

NB I (McF), pp. 12 ff.

5-10 April 1952

Dug Trench 4 down to bedrock except where this has been cut, probably by modern tomb riflers. See plan and photo Film 166-18. In the south corner of trench some pots were found.

The soil everywhere is about the same - light brown very sandy soil - 7 rough stones from foot to bucket size, otherwise hardly any stones at all. These stones came from south corner - level about 0.40 m. The rock is everywhere ammo-chavara.

If one were to dig deeper near south corner one might find the Archaic tomb from which these sherds and pots came.

In addition to above numbered finds, removed also one-tenth bucket of sherds which came from various parts of trench and various levels.

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 5

NB I (McF), pp.20 ff.

5-10 April 1952

Dug Trench 5 down to bedrock and into rock-hewn dromos down to floor of dromos and also into bedrock below level of floor. Christo did this to assure himself that the soft sand was actually bedrock and not simply very sandy soil. Dug out only the tomb end of the dromos. The fill of the dromos shows that an intrusive pit reached down here to the floor of the dromos throughout the part of the dromos which we have dug out - mixed soil and sand and about two wheel barrow loads of rough stones from half foot to foot in size. As one faces the tomb there is on the right a built up stone stele consisting of the same size stones - possibly this was to reinforce the crumbling rock of ammo-chavara. At tomb end on left is a flat stone which clearly belonged to the stamion, but it is not in situ. It is upright, however, one of the flat sides facing the dromos with the bottom about 0. above the floor of the dromos and the top being up against the lower edge of a very long stone () placed here to support the roof of the tomb. Only the side facing the dromos is visible. See Film 166-19. As I study the position of the door stone more carefully it seems to be almost in situ (possibly too high to be in situ?) as placed after some burial in the tomb. It is probably only one of two or more that closed the entrance - the most north-easterly one - but it may have been the only one. It is not quite clear where the entrance of the tomb was, as the rock has been cut in so many places by tomb riflers. Removed sherds in three sacks: Sack 1 from surface to level -1.17 m. below B, Sack 2 from -1.17 to -1.97 m. and Sack 3 from -1.97 to -3.00 m. Sack 1 contained about one-quarter bucket sherds, Sack 2 about one-sixth, and Sack 3 about $1\frac{1}{2}$ buckets. The rough stones mentioned above came from level -1.97 to -3.00 m. No stones higher up according to Christo. For this trench and others, see draughtsman's plan and for this one also section

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 6
TOMB 1

NB I (McF), pp.26 ff.

5-11 April 1952

Dug Trench 6 down to rock-hewn floor of Tomb 1 and down to fallen roof of tomb chamber. See Film 166-20-22 inclusive. Removed jug on top of collapsed roof (see Tomb 1 Finds, No.1). The stratification from surface down to fallen roof in chamber consisted of fill of intrusive pit - sandy soil, bits of chavara but no large ones - some dark soil but only near surface - 4 to 5 wheelbarrow loads of rough stones averaging from foot to bucket size, one near surface with greatest dimension of 1.12 m. Two handfuls of sherds only from intrusive pit over chamber, including frag. of figurine in sherd bag. No other finds. This bag contains finds from level of bedrock over tomb to level of burial. Am labelling this bag 2. Bag 1 contains about three handfuls of sherds from surface down to bedrock level where rock has not been hewn for tomb. Only sherds.

Dromos

Removed from dromos surface down to floor about two handfuls of sherds. The soil in dromos consisted of sandy soil, small bits of chavara mixed with some surface soil. Appears to date from last 50 years or so. Not an ancient fill. Very few stones. Undoubtedly some of the fill may be ancient, as it is difficult to distinguish between the fill of an intrusive pit and an ancient fill where the soil is as sandy as it is here.

There were two burials in the chamber. The remains of Burial 1 were picked up and placed in the SW corner of the chamber and most of the pottery was removed and placed along the south wall. The pottery near the south wall is all at a distinctly higher level than the level of Burial 2, and also higher than the pottery nearer Burial 2, which is consistently at a considerably lower level here. There appears to have been a bank of soil rising from the level of Burial 2 toward the S. and SW corner. Of the seven Bucchero pots, six are at a low level and comparatively near Burial 2. Also comparatively near the burial are pots nos. and these also are at a low level and can be safely assigned to Burial 2. They are practically lying up against the Bucchero ware. Bowls nos. to the SE of the burial are also at a low level and near the burial but not with the Bucchero. They probably also belong although it is possible that they may have been left behind when the rest of Burial 1 pottery was thrown out to make room for Burial 2. I see now, however, that these are like no. which is with the Bucchero pot no. . I see now that one Bucchero is with the pottery I consider to be thrown out. This requires some study.

Nos.1-13, it will be noted, are all comparatively near Burial

2 and all at a low level, very near bedrock, that is, rock-hewn floor or actually resting on it, the only exception being the Bucchero jug no.4. It is doubtful, however, that when they threw out Burial 1 they would have placed a pot here blocking the doorway. As it is much too high to be in situ for Burial 1, we can assume with reasonable probability that it was placed here after the second burial - possibly just as they left the chamber. Another large Bucchero amphora is somewhat remote from Burial 2. No.15, q.v. The remains found in this amphora I am calling Burial 1B. IB may have been a close relative of 2 who had died fairly recently - hence, instead of chucking the bones out unceremoniously in the corner of the tomb they were fondly placed in the amphora with a juglet (her own or a new one?) The amphora may well have been a new one and not one of his or hers. All other Bucchero pots save no. would appear to belong to Burial 2. There is no proof that no. does not belong, but it is somewhat remote and also among what appears definitely to be the thrown-out pottery of Burial 1. I have removed this Bucchero pot and see it has a foot, unlike other Bucchero pots, and that the ribbing is distinctive and somewhat more shallow. Hence it may well belong to Burial 1 - the thrown-out burial.

Removed from top of fallen roof to floor throughout chamber - about one-sixth bucket full of sherds, besides numbered finds 1-49 inclusive.

- P 2232 4. "Pseudo-Bucchero" jug with twisted handle. Vertical ribbing below horizontal band of grooved lines on shoulder. Pinched lip. Light gray buff clay. Gray-black paint. Flat low base ring. Broken neck. Level -2.46 m. at 0.07 m. above floor.
- P 2233 5. Bucchero jug much like no.4 but with brick-colored clay instead of light buff, and ridge at base of neck. Slightly different make, pinched lip. Possibly not same workshop. Strap handle not twisted. Broken lip. Level -2.56 m. at 0.03 m. above rock-hewn floor.
- P 2234 6. Bucchero jug more like no.4 than no.5 in that it has gray buff clay and twisted handle and no ridge round base of neck. Level -2.58 m. at 0.03 m. above floor.
- P 2235 7. Bucchero jug like no.5 with brick-colored clay and strap handle, but without ridge at base of neck. Broken at point of lip. Level -2.57 m. at 0.03 m. above floor.
- P.2270 8. Oval juglet with pinched lip. Brick-colored buff clay. Encircling black bands at level of shoulder and at base of neck. Low flat base ring. Handle missing. Broken but nearly complete. Level -2.61 m. at 0.04 m. above floor. Found inside no.9.
- P 2243 9. Bowl like nos.2 and 3. Broken but about complete. Level -2.62 m. at 0.025 m. above floor.
- P 2256 10. Lenticular flask. Handle from shoulder to neck. Concentric black circles round boss on center of each side. Flaring neck. Plain rim. Handle almost round in section. Dull brick-colored clay, yellowish-buff surface (paint or slip?). Level -2.58 m. at 0.03 m. above floor.
- P 2238 11. Amphora. Strap handle from shoulder to nearly horizontal rim. High but sloping shoulder, vertical neck. Low base ring. Complete and unbroken, so can't examine clay. Black encircling bands on body and shoulder and inside mouth. Level -2.61 m. at 0.04 m. above floor.

- P 2236 13. Bucchero juglet, complete and unbroken. Gray-buff clay. Ridge at base of neck as on no.5. Strap handle somewhat oval in section. Higher base ring than on other Bucchero pots. Ribbing and bands as on others. Level -2.63 m. at 0.01 m. above floor.
- P 2262 14. Jug. Brick-colored clay with white bits. Round rim, vertical slightly concave neck, strap handle from shoulder to neck, ridge at base of neck. This pot (unlike nos.1-13 inclusive) clearly belongs to Burial 1 as broken sherd (14a) was found on floor under thrown-out bones of leg, at level -2.63 m., and other sherds (14y) were found under left shin bone (in situ) of Burial 2. When they threw out this pot, some sherds remained behind (14y) and they then laid Burial 2 over these.
- All on bedrock except sherds under Burial 2.
14a: sherd under thrown-out leg bone.
14b: sherds west of thrown-out leg bone.
14y: sherds under left shin bone in situ of Burial 2.
Clearly does not belong to Burial 2. Level -2.58 m. at 0.02 m. above floor.
- P 2263 15. Bucchero amphora. Complete save for small piece in rim, otherwise unbroken. Strap handle from shoulder to nearly horizontal rim. Low flaring foot. Usual ribbing and horizontal bands. Light buff clay. Level -2.61 m., 0.01 m. above floor, among bones thrown out of Burial 1. Almost full of earth. Sand, gravel, human remains - knee and portions of leg bones near top, also shoulder blades, upper arm frag. I see now that skull occupies lower and central portion of amphora. Human remains not cremated as in bronze bowl of Tomb X. It is my belief that these human remains were gathered up and placed in amphora to make room for new burial. At bottom of amphora came jug no.16 but it may not have come into the tomb at the same time. Is this a third burial? Hip and pelvis and feet and hands not noted, but may be found when we study remains, all of which are being kept. Were the remains gathered and collected and placed into amphora belonging to new or former burial?
- P 2228 16. Juglet, trefoil, low foot not unlike that of amphora(no.15) from bottom of which it came. Black paint on body to foot. Black bands at base of shoulder, at base of neck and on handle. Strap handle from shoulder to rim. Found inside and at bottom of no.15. Does it belong to burial found in no.15 or to new burial, and is a gift from the recent burial to an earlier one of a

relative? A similar problem is: did the amphora containing no.16 belong to Burial 2 and was it used to store the bones of a previous burial, or was it an amphora found already in the tomb, one belonging possibly to the persons whose bones were found by us in it? Or did it belong to Burial 1. Answer to the last question is No, as I see we have three skulls in tomb, one of Burial 2, one of Burial 1 and one of amphora which we may call Burial 1B.

- P 2241 17. Bowl like no.2, brick-colored clay. Level of one sherd in NW corner -2.62 m. on bedrock. More southerly sherds somewhat higher among thrown-out bones. Base ring. Horizontal loop handle (probably another on opposite thus far missing side). Clearly no.17 does not belong to Burial 2.
- P 2259 18. Lenticular flask much like no.10 but coarse ware.
a,b Brick-coloured clay painted black concentric circles on red field. Broken, seems incomplete.
Level, lowest sherd, -2.53 m., 0.07 m. above rock.
" highest sherd -2.40 m.
Lowest sherd among thrown-out bones. Clearly does not belong to Burial 2.
- L 2257 19. Lenticular flask like previous one but much smaller.
Level -2.37 m. at 0.20 m. above rock-hewn floor.
Clearly does not belong to Burial 2.
- P 2246 20. Small amphora. Biconical body, horizontal rim, strap handle from shoulder to rim, flaring foot. Complete and unbroken save for two pieces in rim.
Level -2.43 m., 0.07 m. above floor. Burial 1.
- P 2245 21. Small amphora. One handle an ordinary loop handle, the other like this Light brown clay, black bands, triangles and wavy lines in black paint. Two broad black bands also inside rim. Base ring. Biconical body, vertical neck, narrow horizontal rim.
Level -2.48 m. at 0.07 m. above floor. Burial 1.
- P 2242 22. Bowl much like no.2. This bowl was placed here before the Bucchero pot No.23 next to it, as it is lying slightly over it. Brick-colored clay. Grooved lines encircling bowl just below rim and also round lower part of bowl. On sandy soil. Level -2.35 m. at 0.18 m. above floor.

- P 2237 23. Bucchero jug with strap handle with light buff clay. Unlike other Bucchero pots it has a foot. This is most interesting as it is the only Bucchero pot that we cannot assign to Burial 2 with any degree of probability. It appears to belong, and very likely does, to Burial 1. Another difference between this pot and other Bucchero pots is the comparatively low ribbing.
On sandy soil. Level -2.43 m. at 0.09 m. above floor.
- P 2240 24. Bowl - cooking bowl. Two strap handles from shoulder to rim, coarse brick-colored clay. Round bottom without base ring or foot.
Level -2.51 m. at 0.02 m. above floor, which is high here on sandy soil.
- P 2229 25. Amphoriskos. Complete save for broken mouth. Light brick-colored clay. Foot, two horizontal handles. Black bands encircling shoulder and base of neck. Neck painted in solid black, triangles on shoulder. Yellow-buff field.
Level -2.33 m. at 0.10 m. above floor.
- P 2264 26. Amphora. Coarse light brick-colored clay with dark core. a,b
Two horizontal handles. Triangle between encircling black bands on shoulder. Base ring. Full of human remains, not cremated, doubtless of one previously buried in tomb. Calling this burial 1C. See Film 166.35 and 167.1 and 2. Did this amphora belong to person whose bones are in it or to person who took his or her place on floor of tomb?
Level -2.38 m. at 0.13 m. above floor.
- P 2252 27. Sherds of cup with small horizontal handles, high foot or rather stem. Black triangles between encircling bands. Light tan clay. Under no.26 on sandy soil.
Level -2.32 at 0.12 above floor.
- P 2253 28. Cup. Complete, unbroken horizontal handles, foot. Black bands inside and outside.
Level -2.37 m. on floor which is high here.
- P 2231 29. Cup like previous. Broken, probably about complete.
Level -2.18 m. at 0.16 m. above floor on clean sandy soil.
- P 2226 30. Small bowl with two horizontal perforated lugs. Very dark clay, very thick fabric, dark grey inside and outside. Flat base without base ring. Inside no.33.
Level -2.28 m.

- P 2251 31. Juglet, same heavy fabric as previous. Round foot. Strap handle, round in section from shoulder to cylindrical neck. Ridge at base of neck. Inside no.33 at level -2.29 m.
- Mi 539 32. Terracotta cone. Brick-colored clay, black painted bands. Inside no.33. Level -2.28 m.
- P 2261 33. Low bowl. Two horizontal lug handles. Base ring. Heavy fabric. Brick-colored clay. Incurved lip. Level 2.32 m. at 0.07 m. above floor.
- St 886 34. Biconical object in soft stone, "lampro-petra". Very near thrown-out leg bones of Burial 1. Level 2.32 m. at 0.08 m. above floor.
- P 2244 35. Bowl with foot, horizontal handles. Dull dark brown clay, black broad bands. Up against leg bones of thrown-out Burial 1. Level -2.35 m. at 0.08 m. above floor.
- P 2250 36. Bowl. Very heavy fabric, dark brown clay. Two perforated lug handles, flat base, plain rim. Black undecorated surfaces. Probably will have some gloss when cleaned. Level -2.30 m. at 0.07 m. above floor.
- P 2227 37. Bowl like no.36 lying under it. Incised lines below rim. Level -2.32 m. at 0.05 m. above floor on sandy soil.
- P 2230 38. Amphoriskos. Horizontal handles, low flaring foot, concave neck, plain rim. Light buff clay, black bands wavy lines and triangles on buff field. Level 2.27 m. at 0.05 m. above floor on sandy soil.
- P 2248 39. Jug. Single strap handle, low flat foot about 0.001 m. high. Black clay. Two bones (human) inside, but almost certainly by accident - fell into hole in side where broken. Level -2.21 m. at 0.12 m. above floor.

47. Jug. Foot flaring, strap handle. Brick-colored clay. Decoration uncertain as very dirty, but seems to have black bands round body. Broken in many pieces, mouth missing. Level -2.30 m. at 0.10 m. above floor.

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 8
TOMBS 2 AND 3

NB I (McF), pp. 33 ff.

16 April 1952

Trench 8, north section, dug to level -1.51 m. inside dromos - not down to dromos floor here which is toward tomb end (west end). See draughtsman's plan. Found floor of dromos at east end where it is near top of rock-hewn shaft. Fill of dromos seems undisturbed. Very few stones found from surface down for entire area of trench, and only about one-tenth bucket of sherds. Surface to bedrock in dromos, north branch of Trench 8, removed about two handfuls of sherds. See Films 167-9.

Tomb 2

East branch of Trench 8 contains Tomb 2 - chamber only. Bedrock here at level 1.15 m. Floor of chamber reaches down to 2.41 m. about lowest point. Have cleared entire floor, going down through fill of intrusive pit. This consisted of sandy soil, very sandy and few stones, none larger than walnut size, and some small bits of chavara, none larger than almond size. Tomb chamber had been cleaned out thoroughly save for one pot (no.1). This lay in the NE corner of chamber on rock-hewn floor (ammo-chavara). Rock is everywhere the same - no strata of grave in it. The dromos door stone is in place and intact. The interstices between it and the rock is filled in with rough stones. Among these is a sherd of a Buccherio pot (no.2). The floor is slightly irregular. There is a step on which the door stone rests (rock hewn). It projects 0.13 m. into the chamber from the door stone. See draughtsman's plan and section.

Ready to be refilled 18 April 1952. The intrusive pit contained about one-fifth bucket of sherds within the chamber, from bedrock to floor. See no.3. There is a portion of another door stone visible just east of the one blocking the entrance. Its side projects from the dromos into a pocket between the door stone and the rock-hewn side of the entrance. See draughtsman's elevation. See Film 167-16. Sherd no.2 not showing as already removed.

Tomb 3

Dug out intrusive pit reaching down to floor of rifled tomb chamber at south end of Trench 8 (S. extension, or rather, south branch). Sandy soil, few bits of chavara, few stones - about a dozen, averaging from fist to half foot size. About half bucket of sherds from surface down to floor. Very small portion of floor cleared. No time to continue as I must go to Turkey on Monday. As tomb has been rifled I feel justified in refilling trench.

Removed portion of one broken incomplete amphora (no.1). The entrance to tomb in east corner of tomb. This has been filled with rough stones from foot to bucket size. Have barely cleared any of the walls of chamber and nothing in dromos. Floor near entrance left uncovered - still probably as much as 0.50 m. of soil over it. See Film 167-18. Bedrock at -2.70.

Find Summary

Tomb 2

- P 2271 1. Amphora. Cracked but otherwise complete and unbroken. Base ring, horizontal handles. From handle level to rim, black encircling bands. Wavy line at base of shoulder. Buff clay, yellowish-buff surface, black paint. Slightly down-turned rim.
- Sh 655 2. Sherd, Bucchero pot. Usual horizontal grooves and vertical ribbing.

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 7

NB I (McF), p.7

Dug Trench 7 down to bedrock which is near surface, and dug out intrusive pit in bedrock down to level -1.88 m. Sandy soil, no stones. No sherds or other finds. See draughtsman's plan and Film 166-25. No signs of any tomb or dromos here.

KALORIZIKI, TRENCH 9

NB I (McF), pp.30 ff.

Dug Trench 9 to depth -1.68 m. Compact soft sandy soil. No sign of any intrusive pit, no stones at all. About one-fifth bucket of sherds (sub-Mycenean and pseudo-Bucchero). Found two sides of middle of rock-hewn dromos at north end of trench. See draughtsman's plan. Bedrock at -1.10 m. Have not removed any fill from dromos which appears to be undisturbed. This tomb should be dug if we want to find any more sub-Mycenean tombs when we have more time to dig them. See Film 166-32. I see now that tomb in Trench 8 is almost certainly the tomb to which the dromos in Trench 9 leads. See Trench 8.

TRENCH 10

Dug Trench 10 to level -2.07 m. within a rock-hewn dromos, removing fill of an intrusive pit. Bedrock level -0.83 m. The intrusive pit covers entire area dug. Fill of pit contained sandy soil, bits of chavara, very small, up to 1-2 cms., many stones averaging from half foot to bucket size. About half bucketful sherds - Bucchero and sub-Mycenean.

TRENCH 11

Finished digging Trench 11. Dug here into bedrock without realizing it, it being so soft here, like compact sand, down to level -2.44 m. Top level of bedrock is at -1.24 m. No finds, no stones, only very sandy soil. Filling this up today. See Film 167-3.

TRENCH 12

Filling Trench 12, dug to bedrock at level -1.27 m. Very sandy soil, no stones, no finds. Undisturbed. No photo, no cuttings.
