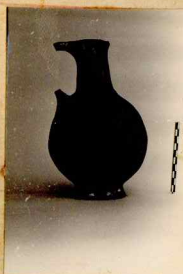

Clay grayish brown, probably straw-brown, for there are numerous tiny pecks but few or no grits. Flakes fairly. Rather thin fabric as shown by hole in wall caused by firing defect. However base and handle sturdy. Rich flaky red brown paint probably once slightly lustrous over the whole.

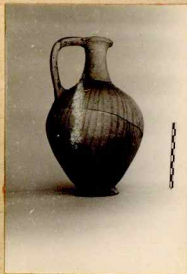

Low flaring ring base, pert ovoid body, relief neck ridge, slender concave neck with flaring mouth and metallic imitating carinated rim (overhanging). Rectangular handle from rim to shoulder. Axis of pot slightly oblique, giving leaning effect. Effect of ribbing obtained by comb, irregular handmade vertical incisions, or rather scrapings,

generally, vertical but often twisting and even overlapping.
The crudity of this ornamentation is in contrast to its
clean lines.

Roughly biconical ring base, elongated ovoid body, neck ridge, narrow tapering neck to flaring ~~round~~ mouth with thin double rolled lip. Rectangular ^{strap} handle from rim to shoulder has a low ridge in center imitating metal prototypes. Effect of ribbing produced by rather rough vertical incisions which sometimes twist and overlap, although total effect is much weaker than in case of P 2810.
