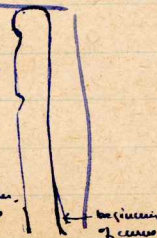

Brown finely ribbed clay. Lustrous red paint. Some mica. 2 pieces
in bag. 26-4-41. "Does not say from where P.T. 73?" P.T. 73,

upper part, p. 607-3a, under wall. 26-4-41" - label. Typical Hell. Pergamon Plate; large.
Q. McC7 IV, p. 632, #11. From P.T. 73; 26-4-41 (larger) + 21-4-41 (smaller);

See p. 549 - 3a + 607-3a. Two pop rim heavy micaceous
reddish gray ware with lustrous black polished surface. cf.
P 2348 and notes on bag for P.T. 73 on August 5-8, 1941.

Q. McC7 IV, p. 706, #34. See popping card for P.T. 73, 21-5-41.

Q. McC7 V, p. 928, #44. P.T. 73; in doorway between jamb Tomb 10 -

east door - west end of doorway - south side near ²³³ jamb
at 0.77 below top of jamb; 24-7-41. Frag. base of bowl (? seen
to be traces of glaze interior); 5/8" h^h clay, rather porous in
texture; heavy tan glaze which covers exterior completely; simple
base ring; gentle curve to walls . Could be Hellenistic.
