1. Marble column base (see pl.p.). at 23-§-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 16, about 30 cm. west of wall running north-south. March 28. Found upside down, roughly 46 x 45 cm. About 135 cm. of col. base in situ on wall running north-south. Ionic.
2. Marble column base roughly 45 x 45 Ρ-8 VOTIOY 3 n. Well preserved - found right side up on west side of Trench in depth of 90 cm. See Stones and Marbles 16, p.43.
3. Marble column base, March 28. 23 Ρ-8 VOTIOY 12 in east side of trench. Upside down, 44 x 44 in depth of 70 cm. See Stones and Marbles 15, p.43.
4. Well preserved marble - 119 x 23 x 12.
5. Marble fragment 18.50 x 14 x 55 (average), 23-0-II . 80-100 depth. Found Fill 2, p.24. Impression left in deposit of decomposed building on south side of trench.
6. Corinthian capital, 38.x 38 roughly. 23-0-II ΒΟΡΙΩ 14-16. Below surface and mosaic.
7. Marble, part of screen probably. 95 x 21 x 21 roughly as preserved. (a) 23-§-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 12-14, 20-40 depth. Also two fragments which go with it. (b) Roughly 28 cm high, continues same motif. Lighter in colour, may fit on top of (1). 23-0-II ΒΟΡΙΩ 12-14, about 40 cm. depth. (c) Top of (1) and (2). 23-0-II ΒΟΡΙΩ 12-14, about 40 cm. depth.
8. Friezes (marble) acanthus leaf, 23-§-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 12-14, found along with No.1 of Marble and Stone Fragment notes, a, 47 x 24, b, 47 x 22. Part of acanthus leaf covers each fragment and each is crowned by a volute.
9. Stone column base fragment 54 x 54, Tr.23 §-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 14-16. Probably has first stone in place in wall north of column base in situ at §-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 10-12 as its stylobate. Only one side preserved. The stylobate is at §-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 14-16 also.
10. Base of pilaster (marble) 60 x 7 at bottom, 52 x 3.50 at top. 23, §-0 ΒΟΡΙΩ 10-11.
11. Inscription fragment on marble 11 x 3.50 cm. x 2. April 1st. Found on surface, 23 §-0 VOTIOY 3, near dump for V-§ VOTIOY 0-4. I 185.
12. Inscription on marble roughly 25 x 26 x 50 as preserved. Inscribed side roughly 25 x 23. I 181.
13. Marble frieze like 8 but with two full acanthus leaves preserved. Fragment measures 46 x 47 cm. Belongs to same frieze as others of No.8. Tr.23-0-II VOTIOY 2-4, depth 40-60. Apparently both aisles had the same frieze as they are found in exactly the same place on both. Volutes in this frieze crown two acanthus leaves instead of one as in others.
14. Corinthian capital, Tr.23 Α-μ VOTIOY 0-2, see photo IV 33, 34, 35.

15. Marble base of Ionic column. 2. East of cistern 4, 120 cm. above it, plinth found. Photo V 4, p.49. Measures 44 x 44.
16. Marble base of Ionic column with plinth $\rho-\delta$ VOTLOV4, 40 cm. over cistern floor. Right side up. Photo V, 11, p.49. Plinth: 44 x 44 cm.
17. Marble base of Ionic column. Tr.23 0-TI $\beta\alpha\pi\iota\sigma\upsilon$ 0-2, near and just west of wall running north-south which has similar base in situ. This base apparently very near when it was over in situ about 136 cm. north of one actually in situ. Greyish marble. Plinth measures 44 x 44 cm. Broken in half. Photo V, 10, p.49.
18. Ionic marble column base in situ 0-TI VOTLOV3 in wall running north-south. Plinth as preserved measures 41 cm. on a side. Photo V, 12, p.49.
19. Ionic marble column base with plinth. Plinth measures 75 cm. on a side. Tr.23 0-TI $\beta\alpha\pi\iota\sigma\upsilon$ on nave wall. Photo V, 14, p.49 and V, 15, p.49.
20. Ionic marble column base with plinth. Plinth measures as preserved 48 cm. on a side. Tr. 23 0-TI $\beta\alpha\pi\iota\sigma\upsilon$. See 1, p.21. Photo V, 16, p.49.
21. Ionic marble column base with plinth. Found in situ Tr.23, 0-TI $\beta\alpha\pi\iota\sigma\upsilon$ on wall running north-south, east of mosaic. Plinth measures about 45 cm. on a side. See photo, p.
22. Tr.23, -T, at T $\beta\alpha\pi\iota\sigma\upsilon$ 12.50. Just below wall on pavement at T. See photo . VIII, 26, p.65. May 11, 35.

Box with label "Tr. 3 outside wall, east ext., to level of rock":

2 fragments glass: blue piece early Roman, i.e. 1st c. A.D.
yellow-green piece probably later, i.e. 2nd c.
or even later.

Pottery frags. #1-2. Brown-black glaze, base ring. Hellenistic, 3rd-2nd c. B.C. Common type of bowl; probably had incurved rim, the most usual. Cf. Tarsus, Fig. 180.

Pottery frag. #3. Red glaze, base ring. Same as above.

Pottery frag. #4. Orange clay, red glaze; out-turned rim. Perhaps from hemispherical bowl with ornament. Could be late Hellenistic, but more like "Hellenistic Pergamene", 1st c. B.C. Cf. Tarsus, Figs. 183 and 189.

Pottery frag. #5. Pinkish red clay, traces of matt red glaze. From bowl with flange below upright rim. Roman, 2nd c. A.D. or slightly later (i.e., the latest piece in the lot with which the piece of yellow glass would be contemporary). Cf. Tarsus, Fig. 194, A, for earlier form.

2 fragments glass: Roman, 1st century A.D.

Pottery frags. 1-2. Brown-black glaze, base rings. Hellenistic.

Pottery frags. #3-4. Grayish biscuit with lime particles, matt gray-black glaze; base rings. Could be Hellenistic of a local variety, but more likely earlier.

Pottery frag. #5. Red-glaze, base ring. Probably Hellenistic bowl, although glaze resembles that of "Pergamene" ware, since the dribble of glaze on the lower exterior wall is typical of Hellenistic provincial pottery.

Pottery frag. #6. Red glaze, base ring. Glaze on exterior only, so possibly from jug. Probably Hellenistic, but "Pergamene" ware not impossible.

Pottery frag. #7. Red glaze, incurved rim of "Hellenistic Pergamene" plate. Tarsus, Fig. 188.

Pottery frag. #8. Red glaze, base ring of "Hellenistic Pergamene" bowl. Tarsus, Fig. 188.

Pottery frag. #9. Red glaze; from angle of "Roman Pergamene" plate with horizontal floor and upright rim. Tarsus, Fig. 193.

Pottery frag. #10. Red glaze; from angle of "Roman Pergamene" bowl with sloping lower body and upright rim. Tarsus, Fig. 194.

Pottery frag. #11. From similar shape, but probably later (harder biscuit, thinner glaze), i.e. 2nd c. A.D.

Pottery frags. #12-14. Red glaze, orange-red biscuit; extremely low base rings, marked off by grooves. "Roman Pergamene". Tarsus, Fig. 193.

Pottery frag. #15. Red glaze; from plain rim of nearly hemispherical bowl. Probably "Hellenistic Pergamene" -- cf. Tarsus, Fig. 188.

Pottery frags. #16-19. Scraps of "Pergamene" ware.

Pottery frag. #20. Red-brown, matt glaze; pocked surface. Not classical.
