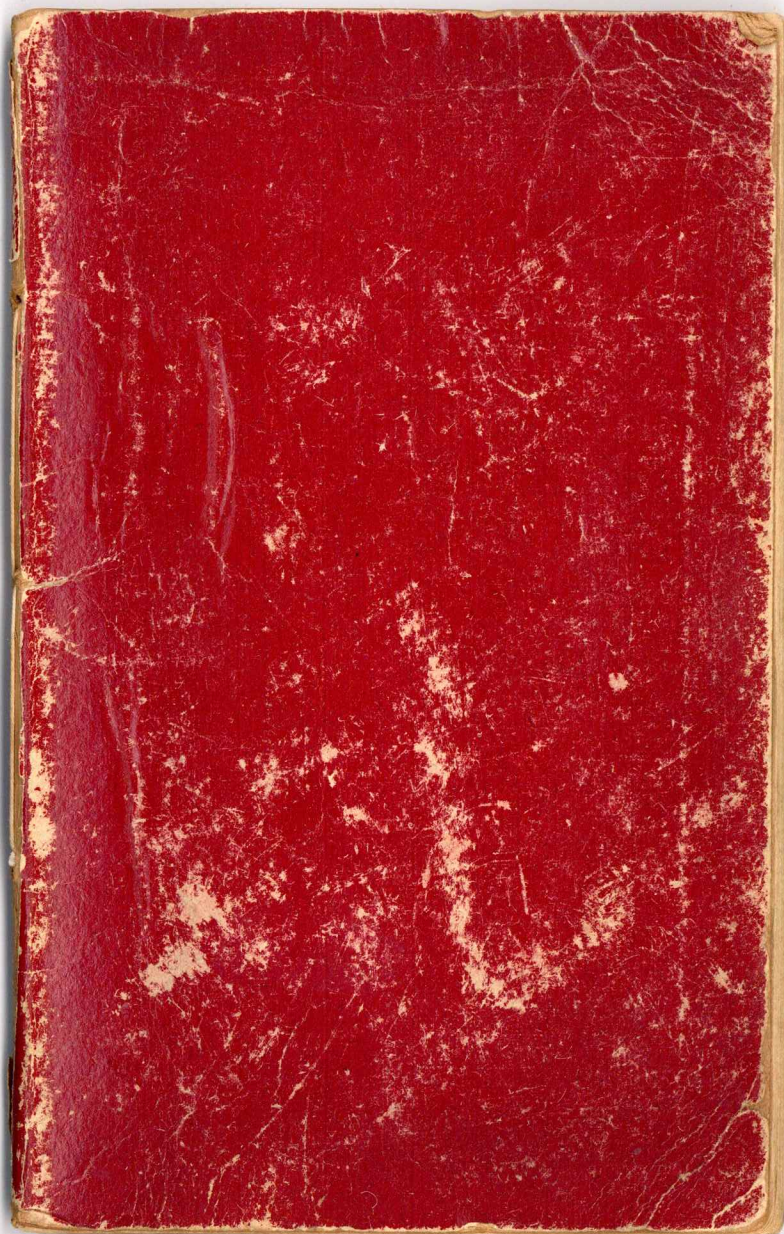

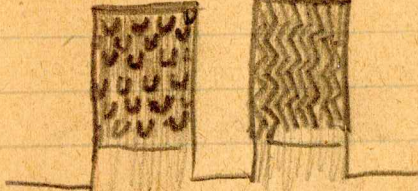

Good dinner on short

bath & read upon sleep.

Oct 9th - 1899. Chota lagini
Got off at 7 - Whiskered Balakrishna
in the driver's seat & he went
faster - 53 animals loaded
going down 56 nearly empty
going up the road. Near from
Gulit for head saw a long
train of cars going down
Lodak cooler yesterday
Potan Nephel family &
Hogk going down -
1 Bullock carts black in
the road - More traffic
in the early AM. Parked
during the heat of day -
occasional must be
light - Cattle also -
At Ghori found the Dera Empty - no
traffic at all. Compared to up trip -
on chid & a mule in dandy coming
down & a horseman Eng. going up
his servant following in a Chh
Breakfast at Ghori - about 9.00

When horn blows - the Bullwhack
Cotters rush to the cattle heads
or place them in the sides with
their long sticks or in their
excitement. They push the
Cott. and the cattle move any
way they choose. The drays rush
into bunches by the road side & stop
and ponies laden with as many foot
things - one bunch of ponies behind
with riders blocked us some time at
a bridge & when we finally got by.
The old grazier folded his hands
& looked very humble as he ap-
ologized for the delay.

Nothing like Below Shon. Several goats
crowded, noticed the fort and temple this
time & many fairs for this time. ~~There~~
a loose camel stood in the way, one foot
knives blew his horn & the camel moved
on down ahead of us. Stables of the
Dung Carrying co. are all whitewashed
& fixed up for this time. Tent for.

Horses are kept in the open now.
Bum horses this trip & the driver
hammered them for four but no use.
Met Honga coming out of Kohala &
two women were at the R House
one writing the other Cheung &
the latter had a pile
Several Ishikhe horses in
the grounds of Dole Bungalow
Kohala is quite a busy place
& Bontye people roled toll
on both sides.

Left Kohala 3 PM. got on faster going up
hill than coming down valley saw
once when we had beefy horses
Bell & I got out using his cone
to hammer the ponies - Camels
turned out to graze - Cleander
sprung again. Kid in cone with
goat behind him. Girl nursing to
beakoff goats. Buggy trussed
birds & upon foot. ^{There}
night when we got up in the

Cold towards morning
 Soldiers & their dogs out
 working. Bullard train
 of soldiers moving into
 yards from tent camp.
 One foot driver blowing his
 horn out of the darkness.
 Came a voice Go on - what are
 you blowing that for - I hear
 a soldier in charge of the Bullard
 train - after that the drivers
 moved on.

Sunny Bank Hotel - fine shot both -
 good dinner and all news-papers
 Oct 1st and July 22 last Bulletin
 to post 5

Oct 10th was called - breakfast
 but didn't get off until
 after 7 am. Came from
 of soldiers tents baggage

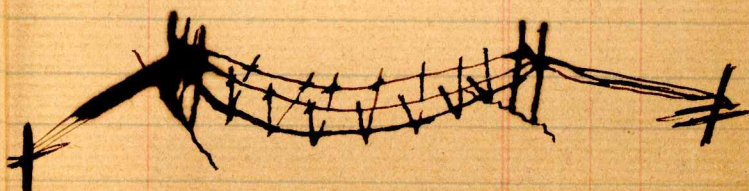
