There is a drain at floor level on west side which indicates both that room was not roofed (debris was from 50 cm at S. to 120 at or above wall slipped) and that this was done by a wing added later. (Other data indicate this it was done by Donley - Purpitt) Because drain leads to n.w. room below. Drain much destroyed by dog root, but apparently originally same width throughout. Rather rough now but probably once smooth + plastered. Stones of floor are set so that shallow trench for drain 6 cm deep +
