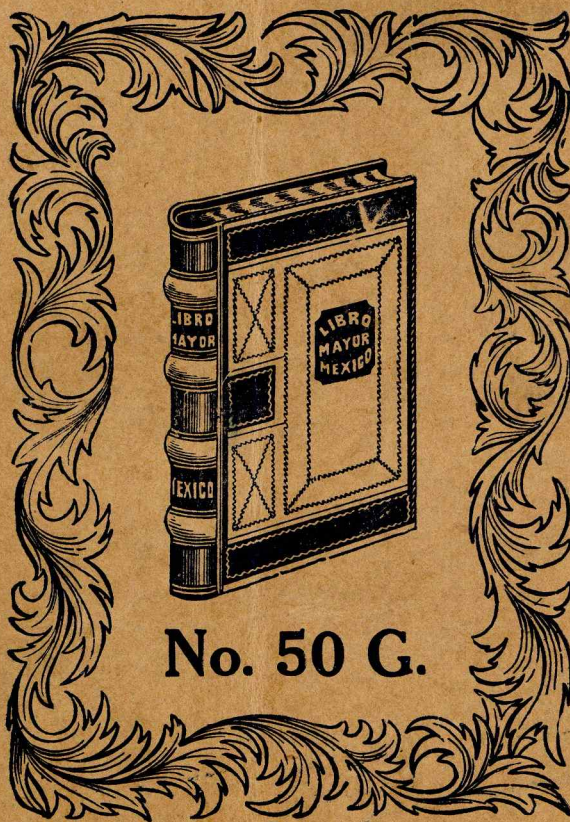

Observations on shales from faya levels.

W-1-1. 1st level: Practically all coarse, red, much weathered, often very thick. Shales up to 1.5 cm thick, thin shales to 2 cm. Rims generally thicker.

Some fossiliferous may be fragments or maybe burnt clay. Mainly fine grained sand & gravel.

terry, Red to buff color. A minority have coarse gravel terry, sand of the buff color instead of red. Also some buff shales have fine paste with sand terry.

Probably difference only in degree of laking, to some are generally in thicker shales. Buff slip evident on some. One large cylindrical with flat sides has . Thin shales of fine sand down to 4 mm, red & buff. Sand with traces of clay color. One evident red, orange & black.

W-1-2 looks superficially very similar, same remarks obtain except for if any fine thin shales, none colored ones. One with red & black color.

W-1-3 looks similar but possibly more thin shales & fine reddish & buff, fine sand & coarse gravel terry. Some with some blackened surface (generally inner). Proportion of blackened & jointed shales much larger than in previous group but still about 1/4. Mainly plain red (or buff) polished surface in the, a few jointed red, orange & black. One buff shale found in sculls.

E1-94. Mainly light shales, good shaly fragments of the low level, but dark to p + one return to G. Also 2 fragments of shales + mica shales mainly darkened.

96. Very good shales, mainly some dark. Some conglomerate with thick vein Γ , some with spots + holes.

which is now much destroyed. Was at height approximately 3 m. below level of floor of building. All so much destroyed is very difficult to follow. Possibly a staircase for door of entrance to platform, but practically gone now due to fall of building. Particularities of certain construction appear before stairs or floor. There are markings on steps below other two doors find a high wall in front of north one; possibly no staircase here. Possibly stepped pyramid with steps in center.

This wall about 140 cm. maximum height. Possibly was a terrace below it, but possibly also steps built against it & now destroyed. Part width of this terrace ledge 160 cm. & apparently steps in front below it, 30 cm wide & 30 cm high. These steps below apparent ledge extend considerably to north, but no traces of steps were found against high wall, none in center. If steps stand on this ledge it may have been built over & steps passed around it, but this too far gone to determine. Set 3 men to making hole at base of pyramid, to follow trench into it & determine construction. About 10 ft from front base of pyramid. On upper stratum soft black humus mixed with small stones & rubble. A few slabs of large red vessels found. Small stones probably fallen from pyramid.

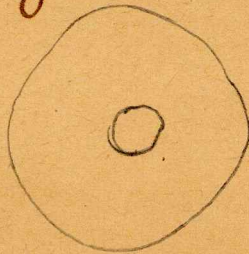

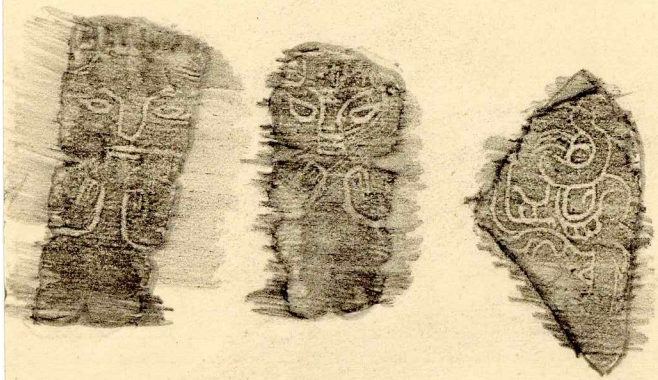
