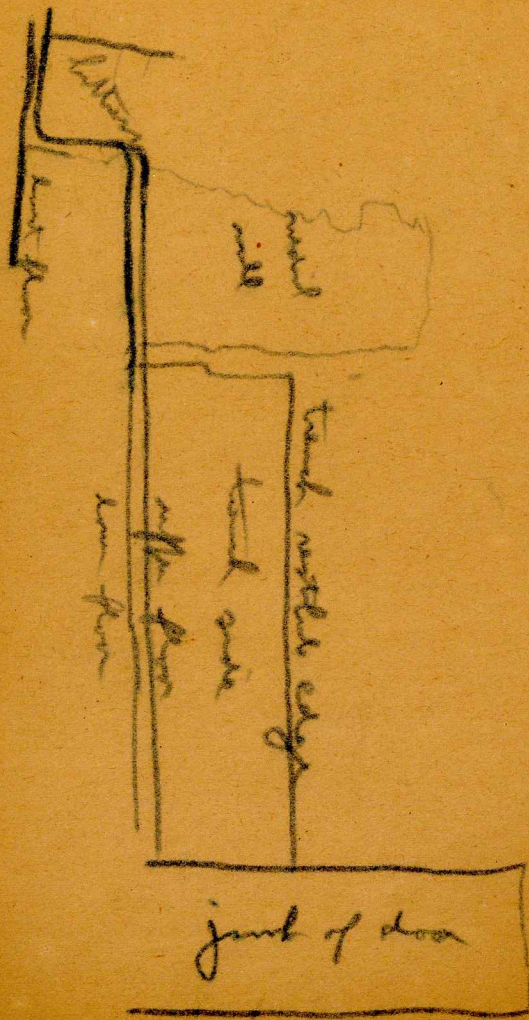

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The upper floor seems to turn up against the edge of the vestibule trunk & to continue across gap between vestibule wall & medial wall. Probably also continued across lattices - they got over. Lower floor probably also across medial wall, turned down underneath the horizontal under lattices & continued horizontally in terrace. Most of this uncertain. No, it probably rest under medial wall. Long blocks before noted at front, near which last wall met, as at base of medial wall.

shed is built on this; a rubble
 or low floor next between this &
 last block of gravel wall & down
 front edge of low blocks. Steps
 below cleaned & photographed. Pully

 trace. Base at considerable
 height (120?) above terrace A
 Max height also this 85 cm.
 Base on relatively even floor
 but not stream. Long fine
 rubble without filler below.
 Top is about 400 ft high

top of high letter will be the terrace
 A and about 30 in. ~~below~~ top.
 above top of this water well.
 Shall dig deeper here and leave
 higher cut below well well for
 present on account of great height
 & rising here. Edward is
 digging deep & more carefully in

 getting off correspondence & business to
 Teonigue. // Arman has done
 much work on pyramid 4 with its
 temple. On east side he found the
 lower part of stela 92 near the
 mound after part four by Maly.
 Apparently unexcavated & one face
 plastered. Probably a plastered &
 jointed stela. On one face
 flat & one convex. About 240
 cm long. The side fully terraced.
 Above a room with walled platform
 2 doors. Fragments of broken
 lintel on one, plaster by Gant

most of glyphs flaked off. Stela
 29 believed to be lintel from other
 doorway. Terrace behind reached
 by main door at S.W. corner
 of temple; probably one at S.E.
 corner. Details of first terrace
 & stairway still to be ascertained.
 Now working on top of pyramid
 # 5. Fred surveying around # 27.
 Point # 139 is S.W. corner junction

 wall at foot of low land terrace at
 right foot & low on S. wall having
 low entrance at east.

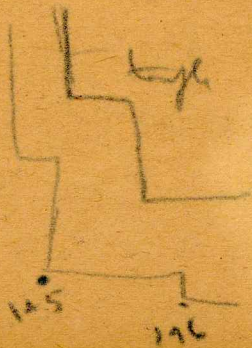

hill at W. side of fragment # 27.

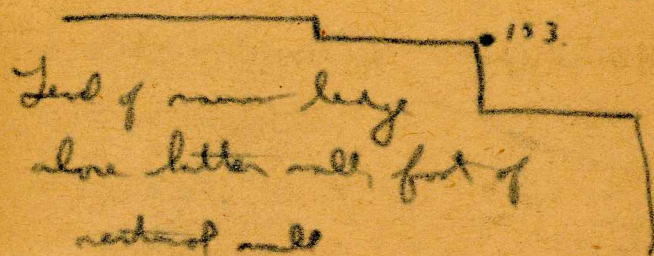

Tuesday April 19. b clear,
 still, somewhat humid & extremely
 hot. 100° flat on shore of bay
 low, east side, at 3.00 P.M.
 Galt took a balloon & stayed in
 camp almost all day except for
 photographing Lint's great pyrite
 mosaic mirror & helping him
 scouted in vault about noon.

We are over budget most of day &
 evening & fear that things are not
 quite so bad as I am figured.
 John Ross returns from up river,
 bringing secured corn. Then worked
 on #27 digging deep, and on
 #42 taking off top of pyramid.

Wednesday April 20.
 b clear & still; will probably be hot.
 Visited excavation of Dave on
 pyramid #5. which is steep &
 high. b considerable excavation in
 rubble but no trace of walls yet.
 Found corals found as yet no
 information of importance.

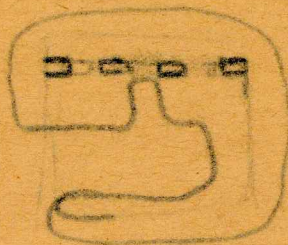

It is being seen down
excavate small figures with
cylindrical drums near station #4.
Observed. The way is uncertain
also to begin stratigraphical
work next. There has been few
important wells, or for miles of
any kind to date. // Sent 2 men
to cut for the 3rd, 4th, 5th with
Dave + 1 man, 7 to work. //
3 men of #27 in sum. They are
now very deep excavating activities.
Very large stones, fine rubble without
much of any fill, a great inter-
stices. Floor of terrace A

now well seen. The next two
floors, both of which formed under
the latter well at one of terrace A,
continued for at least 140 m,
probably to one of the lower wells in
town out. Apparently also formed
under low of outer steps of figures
in front of this, but now cannot
be traced. Excavation on 490
beneath terrace B. at top of latter
well at back of A. Not to be
carried deeper, but further back.
No evidence of anything but
rubble further down // On #12,
4 men are carrying excavations down

below level of floor of second level. About half the pyramids top has been removed to this level, in trench across center, on east side as far east as front wall of upper temple or little on west side.



Much of rubble now lying taken out fell from above. To be

lowering walls of second floor yet found no definite limit to floor. Very hot afternoon 97° in shade at my house at 1:30. Clear, almost no breeze. Feeling a little better than yesterday but not well, weak + listless.

Thursday April 21.

Another still, clear hot day. Slightly misty + slight breeze. Stayed in camp till 10:15 anyway, packed up room which was yesterday, and fixing budget. Ross left to see how Todd is getting on.

4 new excavations tot of 42. Are following near all, return, down to floor & making better wall. ||
 One # 27, 3 new low front good better wall deeply buried & about level they are now making on slightly in front of high better wall level. B. It may be terrace. These are just burrows like those of better wall at back of terrace. A one is certainly terrace wall. Very well built. Helped Tent stay in her vault all afternoon. Not quite so hot, but bad enough.

Friday April 22.
 Slight mist but some breeze. Hot but not so uncomfortable. Went to dig at 8:30 after buying eggs & getting some letters off. || Tent is digging on top of chambers between east & south courts. Is abandoned stone drums appear to be altered. || Dave has left pyramid # 5 & returned to # 4, clearing steps & terrace. Will also excavate mygdalite staining leading to terrace in front of this. || Mary's man digging in row. He dug a

pit between #26 & 25 & found
 bedrock at level of about 1 m. //
 On 27, I saw an interesting cut
 in order to clean deeply buried
 well better & see interior construction //
 I saw on #42 how cleared
 north & east interior walls down to
 level of interior ledge or terrace.
 The wall was about 69°
 W of N, the east wall about 26° E
 of S. just 70° angle though little
 variation. Both are comparatively
 well made of large blocks with one
 relatively straight face, but not in
 same course or tiers. The

rear wall is relatively straight in
 center of ledge (v. ~~of~~ ~~flat~~ limit of
 face decoration) but sloping
 outward at top (little) toward
 right (east) & much set back in
 one place. P.s. of 20-25 cm off
 perpendicular at highest & not
 vertical joint. Much destroyed at
 top and uncertain if it rose to
 top level of 2d floor which is
 225 cm above 3d floor (ledge)
 at foot of this wall. Base is
 570 below (v. of) inner side of
 & vertical plaster of tough clay
 and east limit at base of east

well, is ± 9 m. east of opposite
 medial line of ledge. Presumably it
 extends equally far to W. & therefore
 18 m long. The upper or 2d floor
 is well only against W. cut
 back, good plaster, not well
 against a doorway well a
 against cut to S. where fine large
 rubble appears, probably fallen
 T. upper floor at east. There
 is no eastern or southern limit to
 this room. Examination
 seems to indicate 2d level (wall)
 floors, in or level on chisel &
 plaster good, + 1.4 m. at depth

of + 30 cm. But both very
 uneven, due to settling & to dropping
 of large rubble on them. Upper
 floor certainly is above top of
 sea wall; low floor uncertain
 but probably. Wall certainly
 continues to old height of lower
 level floor. Upper level floor
 almost certainly continues over sea
 wall, low level floor uncertain.
 On the one corner, junction of
 sea & east walls, very uncertain,
 but likely to dispose hypothesis
 that both walls are interior room
 walls, dropped from interior.

Near wall certainly increases in
 slope from about vertical vertical
 line of May to slope of 72° at
 this point. But they will not
 be fully disintegrated at this corner: east
 wall apparently built against it but
 not certain. East wall much
 less disintegrated but very likely
 fallen to E. & to W. Do climb
 for distance of about 3 m from
 near wall P. one will be full to S.
 Shows all appearance of eastern
 better wall with face at angle of
 about 60° & regular. If it be
 it did so very regularly &

without look for northern half of
 3 m. Northern half must be near
 wall disintegrated. Mosaic light
 also large 120 m vertical. Base
 is about 270 from near of
 highest terrace of pyramids east
 and level of large wall about
 230 above this terrace, as calculated
 from 5 m file which was set
 at base of Chertem when it was
 filled up. Large clay near

Good plaster face + plaster floor
 layers (S) not found in best
 section as it was at first in
 central line, now filled up. Rubble
 fill has possibly or certainly filled
 with earth below level of ledge.
 Above ledge level it was fine
 rubble without earth. Yet no
 section floor above at ledge level
 & no pronounced difference in
 outside street went against
 rubble at S side. Good floor
 now found at base of ledge
 wall at right of + - 50 in
 below ledge level.

Ch # 27, ⁴ men are working out to
 make more efficiently & because more
 will better. Ch W. side of cut,
 2 well plastered floors are seen at old
 level of terrace A. Lower (S)
 limit was missing, torn out. Foot
 is a little below base of wall at back
 of A, by a little above, but well
 section floor - probably rubble floor
 pushed down by weight of wall. Not
 clear on the side, but on east side
 both floors were under wall and
 for some distance in feet of (S)
 & below (or) of base of wall.

Flows slip slightly as they go south downwind. On west cut low floor can be traced for about 120 from base of wall at back of A. with traces of floor above & fine rubble fall below with interstices. Beyond this is probably recent fall, stone & earth mixed. On east side can be followed for only 250 + the edge of last years cut. with sloping bank of fine rubble fall below & layers of flows can also be traced on inner (w) side of terrace A well, for short distance on W side & for 170 m on east side.

slip slightly upward as they go back, but very uncertain on morning beyond this (~~is~~ ^{is} ~~is~~ ^{is} fine rubble fall with no trace of floor, but this may be very recent fall during excavations) until far back at a little higher level (could be seen looking across of slope) where floor appears at face of new cut. Was well + step in front of this, now torn out. Or new this above this? Of course correctly, this new above, running up from level of terrace A which is now about 2 m above point

level of cut. The first step of this stairway may have been at end of this floor level (A) but if so, why the floor level at new? The step fully connects with behind & led up to higher level. Saturday April 23.

Misty & humid in early morning. Slight breeze. At camp till 7:30 // 5 men on #42 looking thru east wall. Seems to be

thick & with outer wall also sloping, indicating sloping from outside. Unsettled yet. #4 men on #27. Slight of top of restful trench above plaster on which found plaster stand (terrace D) is 275 cm.; W although floor is about only 150. W like trench should therefore be raised 125 cm. a sloping floor ~~at~~ between niched wall & feet plaster raised. P is 5 m east from front edge of niched wall at same side of ledge in feet of room B to front edge terrace C, just about as on W's plan, and

about 230 from room to room of
 plaster B7 (between rooms B-C)
 which is about 150 thick. = 380,
 which also agrees fairly well with
 W's plan. This distance 125 in
 height accounts for most of the
 difference between the 360 cm measured
 + 160 cm result on plan in
 depth of buried lowest step (on
 top out) below low restable floor
 (written below p. 27) At this point
 a message came yelling that the camp
 was being bombed and we rushed down. There
 were with laboratory, dining & office,
 my house, J. & D. Davis house, & station

nearly gone with practically all
 contents. Efforts concentrated on saving
 books & other buildings & with success.
 In my house saved 3 suitcases & lost
 books, binders & most of clothing &
 toilet articles; J. & D. are lost most.
 In station all drawings, drafting
 supplies lost. In office, only 2
 binders, typewriter & vitrola saved.
 My notes saved in suitcase - but
 dinner, records & copies only a few days
 ago. All office supplies & photo-
 graphic equipment & films gone, including
 about 50 negatives taken, also all
 correspondence, etc. Found large

canvas, and digging equipment was in
 use and used. After fire burnt out
 sent man for John. Fire began
 in roof of kitchen, probably from
 chimney. Spent afternoon making our
 plans for salvageable objects. John
 arrived about midnight. Sunday
 busy all day making writing letters, +
 got them off after lunch. Monday
 cutting timber + jobs for new house.
 Looked over files of papers + found a
 good deal salvageable. Helped Tim
 dig in vault + figured new budget.
 Tuesday. All men working on new
 house. Worked on budget + helped

Tim dig in vault. Tuesday the
 same. From laboratory, all skulls
 + bone vessels were lost or so
 ruined as to be useless, skull objects
 practically destroyed, flints generally
 badly crushed, jaws generally well
 preserved. Wednesday April 27
 No rain now for many days.
 Scarcely very hot, still a humid.
 Men worked on beginning work
 earlier, so set clock on house
 ahead. I remember of new house done
 + kitchen nearly completed. Budget
 figures showing end of active work.

Spent most of day figuring budget.
Thursday 28. House mostly tacked
 today, fittings & walls put in &
 place prepared for occupancy.
 I help List put of every day
 to reconstruct vault which is now
 nearly done, showing many fine
 jade pieces, etc. Much of day
 until 11.00 P. M. writing letters.

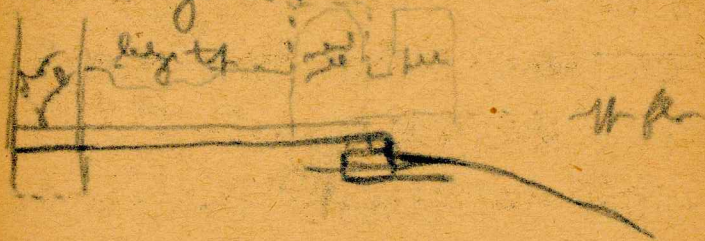
Friday April 29.

Skinned with threatening clouds
 men back to work at least after
 5 1/2 days work in camp. 5 of
 # 12 & 5 on # 27. Sent 2 of
 latter, one to help Anson & 1

to help Parvis. It is just
 about 4 or 5 feet of
 just of upper doorway to high
 brick wall, placed correctly on my
 plan on cross-section paper.

Approx floor above this is 285
 cm below top of wall of vestibule
 trench, and top of wall built this

 only slightly below same under

plaster of door jamb, under
 trench wall and under miscal
 wall at foot, all of which were
 built for it. True wall
 behind near a foot room, lower
 was under this. To the four
 feet are therefore older. This
 floor turns down for 40 in &
 that to foot of floor at distance
 of 225 from door jamb & then
 to foot & slightly sloping again
 for at least 50 in, passing under
 outer plaster built against miscal
 wall & then, slope slightly down

~~The red mud~~ floor
is 7 or 8 cm below this at base of
limestone section, and
only 50 cm below it at northern
edge at side of red mud wall.
There are some ~~large~~ large
narrow blocks which make
red mud, slightly sloping.
I cannot be taken further in than

A, ~~and~~ and well is about 230
 below foot base of same well at rear
 of A, on left (W) side. This is
 50 m greater distance than plotted on
 plan, and 10 m greater height. On
 right or east side it is about 280
 below base of well at back of A and
 low well is about the same 230
 m of well at back of A. As roughly
 measured, base of this well & floor is
 about 720 S of and 890 below
 junction of top of vertical trench
 well & first junk of doorway.
 This is practically exactly as
 plotted on plan.

Take floors at the level of terrace
 A. on slo well, well protected,
 benches below the well at the
 rear on the east side and in
 front on the west side. Benches,
 can be traced for about 160 m
 relatively level, & then at a gentle

Sunday May 1.

Todd expected to get packed and
leave today, but too much to
be done. Got steta #6 in
box and on muzzo and tipped
muzzo for moving two feet of
#90. Had thunder in
afternoon, first of season.
Humid.

Monday May 2.

Took whole day to put two
feet of #90 in boxes and on
muzzos. No difficulties with down
fall, but heavy upper part, muzzos
with box, also nearly 9 tons, caused
much trouble. Used $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch rope
hook & dropped box 3 times, once
from height of several feet, and
split box. I finally got it on
box and on muzzo. About 8.00
evening before 3 half muzzos were
down hill onto flat. Todd
left shortly afterwards. Rained
again but in afternoon & then

closed. Paul White's job helps
 fishing yesterday & today. Edward's
 men started Sunday & worked on #27
 today, going out for further
 excavations.

Tuesday, April 3.

Still a humid, mild day. Some
 clouds but not threatening. 4 am on
 #12 have nearly cleared off a
 corner of pyramidal to eastern &
~~rather~~ see of one of traps
 but without finding any shells,
 according to the report, I have
 been too long to keep an eye
 on this. 5 am digging on

#27. The three middle wells
 excavated will be considered A, B, C
 from left to right. On B, a
 mistake was made. It is not a
 button, at any rate, no water to
 left or right. In fact, the surface
 water to left being nearly a bank
 on the upper corner of mound, the
 low corner containing to left, may
 be an exact fault or - not yet
 cleared. Top of this well is very
 irregular with no floor evident
 above it. No further notes on C,
 but button to left seems to have
 been filled by falling rubble.

Spent late morning & early afternoon
on repairs accounts. Returned
to #27 at 3:30. Threatening
rain again, but now well
cleared. Batten to well C at
base but not filled & is intact.
I look at its base uncertain.
Left early because of threatening rain.
A shower about noon today, one
about 5:00 P. M. and a longer &
heavier one with lightning at night.
We abed on accounts a bit at
night but mosquitoes & insects on
bed that I returned early under
mosquitoes.

Wednesday May 4. Very still,
not, not so hot after rains.
4 men on #42 & 4 on #25.
The face of well C is only about
2 m below (or off) top of terrace
A at base of well. (170 cm down
on floor is apparently correct.
Top of top of well C is about 210 below
level of terrace A as shown on plan.
Two plaster floors of terrace A
will show on W. side of cut. Two
good floors on terrace A in front
of well in 15 cm apart. Probably
better all of A rests on upper floor
but uncertain; if so, floor is

faced down under wall. Lower floor continues to n. of the latter terrace wall. On east side of int. lot, both walls continue over a ledge for some distance. Also a fissible vertical wall at same height as latter terrace wall built on opp. side. Both floors continuing behind this. This uncertain wall is about 130 behind latter terrace wall & is shown on plan in approximately the position, at foot of terrace C as seen of B. which shows as floor above latter wall of A on west side. B behind latter wall of terrace A is

rubble with red earth fill, undisturbed. One foot is rubble with dark brown earth, filled for recreation of last year, or probably earlier fall from debris. On the w. side, the floors of terrace A can be traced perfectly for 250 or 5, then dip down & less clear. One above rubble fill to 350 & rubble with a little earth to 450, then debris, rubble & mud dark earth. No definite division lines between these. The well shaped stone which first discovered built into the wall & covered with plaster & which was

// Binomial wall is ready to be plaster
 taken up, but never here made it
 too muddy, & it cannot be done
 just now. // On pyramid # 12,
 4 men have largely cleared east
 side down to level below middle
 (2d) floor. Parts of lateral # 7 were
 used to support a eastern wall &
 eastern section of front wall allowed
 to fall. Probably east vertical plaster
 will be filled also. No niches found
 in this excavation yet. But
 2d floor shows against edge of east
 of section left to south, but
 apparently it is slightly domed

then in cut out. About 30-40
in lower. The floor is evident,
but no plaster surface seen.

White, lime-enriched, rubble below
with felle mass above about 30-50
cm of rubble & bones without intention,
but packed, above that. Then more
rubble, not so white above, and one
surface first layer of rubble &
bones. No bedding stones in upper
rubble layer, a little earth, so
not a fall. Four thick layers of
bones & rubble suggest a period of
abandonment, followed by filling of
rubble & bedding of upper temple.

Floor seems to continue almost
to front edge of pyramid at
cut, about 8 m east of e.
side of e. cut plaster = 315
below level of upper temple floor.
This edge of cut is about 350

Probably built against wall which
 is good & better built. East
 edge is about on vertical line of
 upper temple and 155 w. of wall
 inset. Probably steps, as it
 runs on one long block, & better
 clearly noted against wall (C)
 may be more. This also indicated
 by fact that found edge of this
 descent is at flat with front
 of this terrace floor, but is

35 in high from it, plaster in
 feet on floor turning up against
 it. Western limit of this mortar
 Batteries (steps?) in front of
 wall C has its front 65 in in
 front (S) of wall C, and its top

level, shown against wall C &

 that now is floor at level of stone
 column in center & considerably low
 level against cut on south side.
