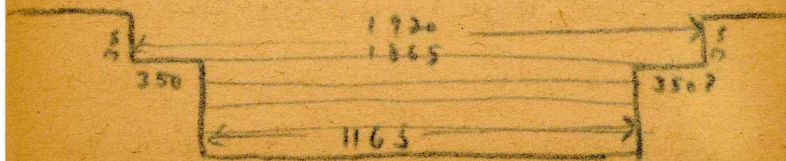

Monday May 9.

Hot, rather dry, slight breeze.
Very hot. Spent all morning in
camp writing letters supposed to go
off at noon. Now decided not
to go till tomorrow. Up to river

early morning for up river. 11
4 men with 2 burros on # ~~39~~
#42 have nearly cleared floor of
3 tier structure. Large entrance?

 Esteban. Made another photo of
 burial in vault. Try to help

Dave with his hand. This is
 very puzzling. Bones, as in result,
 apparently in better position but
 very missing & about all very much
 decayed, bones disintegrated. No
 ribs evident. Skull unbroken, 155
 cm from top of cranium to only
 to be found. As to be in good
 position, in this. Bones much
 broken but fully complete, a few
 other long bones in good condition.
 Dave says the plaster floor lay over
 all with slab over head. Bones
 certainly beneath under plaster floor,

some about 5 cm from top of
 floor, other more. Some lying on
 ledge of wall found to east, &
 some at low level, 5 cm down,
 on earth just under floor. Some
 fragments found in rubble at stairs
 beneath floor. Not sufficient
 below floor for burial in flesh.
 I study to see surface to be
 used burial. Dave says there was
 no high floor, only full from
 2 pyramids. Probably a burial place
 in apparently better position & fully
 a sacrifice. We also have been

strong to make ordinary burial
just under floor, but possible.

Wednesday May 11

Excavation on #27 had proceeded
until close below inner doorway of
upper temple & two days work making
below the high cut, no floors
seen close but close well B, the
last floor W all C dropped &
left in dress floor. Decided to
fill walls of temple above & to
hunt next floor below, then to
clear debris and make up four
lowest floor. Began to fill



plaster thickness at door jacks.
Architrave of doorway - rubble.
Probably some corbel with joints fell
in ~~some~~ section under floor of
next central room just west of vestibule
over white safety, central section was
left, but impossible to make this
safely. One fact I forgot that
it went too late. West section of
long wall in front of central rooms
seen. Masonry set in yellow,
probably mainly plaster. Base of
this wall is about 6.5 below floor
of vestibule which seems to be same as

base of lath plaster of door jamb.
 Wall between rear + front rooms also
 seems to be nearly facing with yellow
 earth filler. Rear wall of nest
 entered room goes down deep into
 upper floor, probably to depth found
 last year further in in the room.
 Jamb removed from doorway, showing
 original wall to be about 145,
 thickness of wall 120. Plaster of
 rooms nearly laid up, mostly of
 very large blocks or slabs with
 facing decomposed lime, not yellow
 but gray. These lathings start on

good
 plaster floor at height about same
 as vestibule floor. On W side, lathings
 + all at base for present total height of
 175. At east side a projecting ledge
 stone at height of 180. Pattern of
 wall of yellow gravel fill, with small
 rubble + stones. Wall built on
 good floor about 30 in below level
 of base of plaster at vestibule floor.
 Last floor of nest entered room
 at level of base of this wall at rear
 of room. Plaster shows well on
 base against the wall + masonry
 is excellent, with very well selected

roughly rectangular blocks with
 good straight face and few small
 cracks. Should have noted this as
 one of the examples of masonry. At
 the base, the floor beneath the plaster
 of the door case is well plastered &
 plaster turns up against end of wall
 against which plaster buttress was
 built. The front of the log wall
 on front of the next central room is
 40 less than the rear of the wall but
 is about 90 thick, but it does not
 seem to be filled. Rubble fill
 below 7' or so front register

fully out at base of wall but 20
 or so higher. The top of the
 plaster of floor beneath plaster of
 door turned up against end of wall
 against which it was built, as before
 noted, but plaster of this end of wall
 continues straight down for 25 or
 below floor and buttress to level of
 base of main wall. Several layers of
 plaster flowing seen under buttress
 top floor and buttress. Under
 floor and buttress found 5 inch
 bits of floor red mud, apparently one
 corner & 4. was about equal size.

 preserved. // This well in good
 condition, perfectly centered & good,
 but poor quality of masonry, large &
 small stones, poorly selected, few
 straight faces, no suggestion of
 courses; large interstices. Floor
 of large room extends clear across

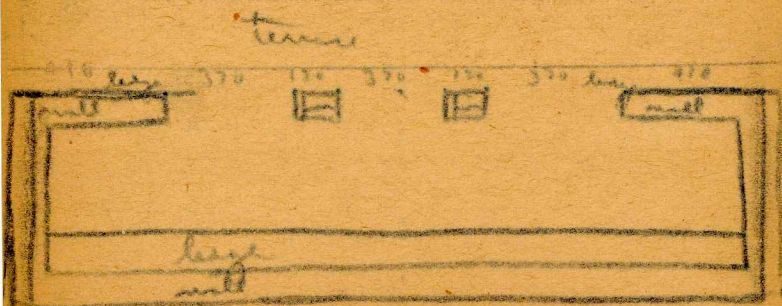
and does not stop at ledge in front of mill, but ledge has been filled up or raised with rubble & plaster floor continued across. Cannot be called a "good" floor & is ~~more~~ certain in only one place on south side of cut near to rubble south ledge mill. This S. ledge is ca 25-30 wide, & mill at front is 40-50 high above lower floor, which is ~~plaster~~ rubble plastered. At distance of 185 from W. end of E. section of mill, a rubble mill crosses lower floor

from north to S. (Some rubble is found above upper floor level?) Ledges only to height of upper floor about 40 in. Both with rubble, but on S. rubble mill lower. Ledge mill apparently plastered. Rubble mill is with 150 or 180 from east end of W. section of mill, this is long narrow on account of fall. At cut against about north, upper (2d) floor is from 40 to east end to 80 at W. end above top of east section of south mill. Therefore is 220-260

higher than main 3d low floor,
 260-300 higher than floor in part
 of south bay, and 170-210 above
 north ledge. The south side of
 the east section of the S. well is
 followed for at least 910 feet
 from W. end, which is 30-50 m
 greater than that figured for
 length of N. side of this well (265)
 plus width of east well (100-110).
 East well at this point therefore 195
 thick. Esquima returned only at
 low, and above that all fallen.
 I allowed a short distance to

mouth and made certain of it.
 Some rubble fell outside it. But
 when east well was cut through at
 joint further north, fell seen was
 like debris, rubble filled with gog
 and no interesting. West
 section of well is, as suspected,
 a pier, not a well section,
 indicating that this lower temple
 had several doorways, probably 3,
 very wide. Apparently only 120
 wide, but same as thickness,
 making it square section, only 30
 m behind (or off) for rubble

n-s. wall. This w. end of this
 pier is about 2 m. from central
 line n-s of upper temple, & since
 east entrance is about 370 wide,
 it may be presumed that central
 entrance was of like width and
 that 3 low temple was fairly
 well entered with upper end of
 construction somewhat as below:



This is very long & wide room &
 could have been roofed only by
 timbers. No capitals found in all
 excavation. Alder was apparently
 larger than ~~was~~ now recent ones.
 Floor at south beyond ledge
 wall is very uneven, it will
 in most places be soft. Ledge
 wall probably continues to east end
 of s. boundary wall & this case

 is about 2 m west of least rubble
 wall seen. Seems to run clear

from rear wall to front of pier

 east end against pier & also over
 s. ledge where it is reduced to
 one tier. Possibly ledge n. of
 the pier was higher, as the block of

Friday, May 13.

Unlucky day? Let's see. As
usual, clean, still a lot. Per cent
till 7:30 - then up to #92 which
is now well cleared. 4 numbers:
Ready for photography. Now cleared
next as far as actual height
triple at which first high rubble

actual base of 30 lb triple
also found by discovery of another
perfectly altered stone, identical with

carefully piled around stone, not touching
it except at top. Stone entirely
black, + earth around it black.

Set John to work on books. 10 Am 92, 3 men are digging for under floor & one falling down into well or into

side to find first terrace. # 27 4 men excavating. From top of latter well at rear of terrace A, a floor was laid for 280 cm, joining over top of foundation all at 125 level (n. of) top of latter well. At this 280 cm just there is a discontinuity with above terrace all, & a floor continues without at 40 cm greater height. Probably excavated for by self of rubble foundation. T b 125 cm just is the top of the well of terrace B & C (G & H on floor) & is

shown on plan. 280 in front is
 about at first edge of great water
 pit to e. (directions made on
 east side of cut) as shown, + plots

Tuesday May 17.

Several stars of reason begun
last night & lightning & heavy
rain in early morning. Rained
much of morning. No work done.
I straightened up office, wrote
letters & figured accounts.
Continued packing in afternoon &
I photographed. Todd had
had job packing #33 in box & it
took him all afternoon. I was
worked on #27 & #42. Todd
did not get #33 boxed & blamed
somebody.

Wednesday May 18.

Alternate clear & cloudy. Wind
but not hot. I did not make in
camp till 9:00. Todd came off
#42 as they had gone very deep &
found no definite floor, a few
degrees. Sent them to work on
pyramid #3(?) Made many
photos. I was continued on #27,
rearing fella rubble. Watched
Todd much of day loading. Loaded
#33, lites 4, 13, two & bed of #15,
leaving only bed of #14, light lites
#12 to be lowered & lites 4 to be transferred.

Thursday May 19.

A little rain & very threatening little systems afternoon. Misty in morning, breeze off. Seemed still, few clouds. Stayed in camp till 9:00, preparing catches in Spanish. I was getting my gear ready with rain.

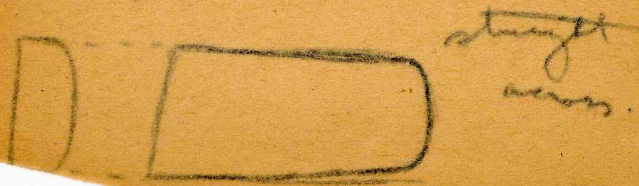
