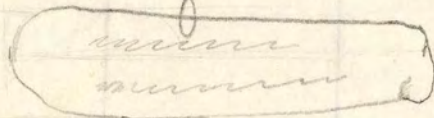

These sherds on the bed-rock and in dark clay resting on overlain by large stones on which in turn rests the so called "red layer". A little charcoal. (Bird bones??) This level is probably a continuation of level #8 and #10 at a higher altitude, nearly with the natural surface of the hill which is bed rock. The red layer seems to correspond to level #4 farther down the trench. All this to be worked out on sections.
