

Note on Piefras Negras
Object Catalogue, and Storage.

This catalogue (original and carbon) gives control for seasons 1931-1937.

For 1939 only the first sheet got prepared and typed. At this time the catalogue was being based on "Bag Sheets" and "Study Sheets".

However, a ms. cat. without full data on proveniences was made up (in the field?); it may be consulted for general locations and the ~~appropriate~~ appropriate Bag Sheets will give all provenience data; Study sheet covering the same field number will give full descriptive information so far as determined in the field - associations, etc.

Knowing the field number from "Preliminary Catalogue" find it among the "Study Sheets" (rear of binder); note the Operation Number and particular Bag letter concerned - and find that among the Bag sheets at front of binder.

Checklist (original and carbon) is for finding correlation of field numbers and final Museum catalogue numbers, the latter in ink on the specimen. This is supposed to appear already in the catalogue, before 1939. There is also a checklist of Structure Nos. and corresponding operation numbers.

Finding List = "Location Catalogue".

Objects are stored in numerical order of their final numbers (?); Michael's finding list give the Tray number in which a given Museum Cat. number appear. "T" in these tray numbers is for "Temporary".

The tray numbers are on the paper tray covers only - care should be ~~taken~~ taken to get the proper cover back on the proper tray (we must remedy this - in the mean time, please drop a card with the tray number in the tray, and leave it there - the cover can then be safely put out of the way till replaced.
