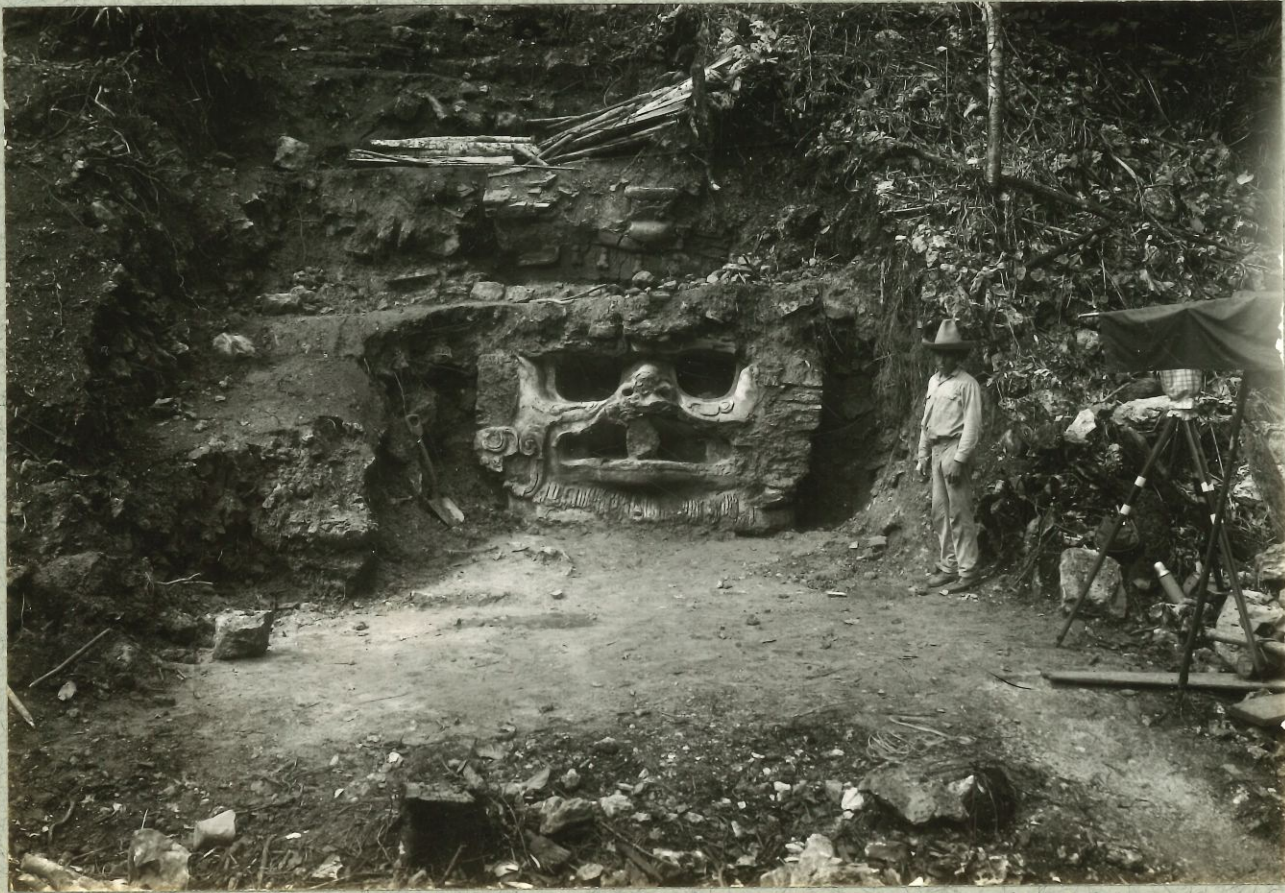

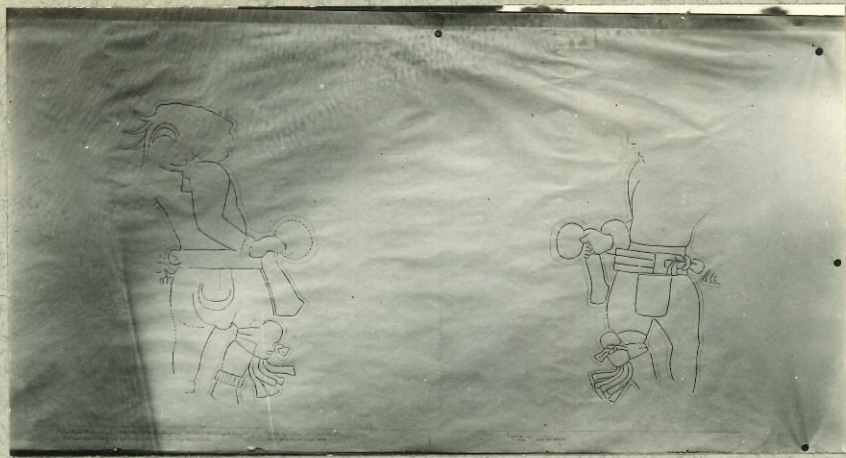

The No. 3 is in line with 1 & 2, at floor level and base of our cut through debris; the slabs at right were isolated, and apparently fell in this position fortuitously; Depth of debris is about 80 cm; xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx xxxx At the right a trench cuts through to the rear (see 33-195 for side of this trench.</p>
