After lunch. A note from Eleanor says she cannot come on account of the death of an Uncle. We are sorry, but will hope for a visit later. The boys play Dudley to morrow at Dudley. We had thought we might dine over. Mrs. H. Child asked lots of questions about you & said she wished you could be down in N. Y. the last of June. I think she rather dreads the wedding - but I tell her she will enjoy it. I think Mrs. Poine & Aunt Sara will go too. I feel very glad that you can go to Anne, and am sure that is by far the better plan. I will take this to the P. O. and finish up other matters. Your father says he is going to resign and live with his daughter. I almost think I ought to write a letter of thanks to Dr. Haffin. What will Smith say now! but we love you best of them all. Mother Woodstock. May 8-1903

I have a little curiosity to know of the relative talents of the two addressed right. I had quite a time spelling. I am high in the Union. J. H. The telegraphing was quite good. I am about 11. J. M. I think we will drop the Tribune, too. Notice of your fellowships this time. Mrs. McEllean sends love. Miss Peasey is in Prov.

Dear - The good things do come your way, and we are all glad for we know you deserve them. I think every one feels a kind of pride in you. There is a general feeling of disappointment among the boys that you are not to be here in June. Cornelius says he shall stop off in Cleveland to see you. I think your father and Clarence are rather unconvinced to your not being here for graduation exercises - but even you cannot be in two

places at once. I shall be glad
to hear all the particulars of your
fellowship - &c. &c. Don't you really
think you should tell Mrs. H.
Smith this time, just from
courtesy? I am busy as usual
cooking, sewing, pasturing & ^{preparing}
seeds, sweeping, dusting, trying
on my yellow & two white waists,
& getting ready for Eleanor Stangle
whom I expect to visit to stay
over Sunday. I hope not to
get too tired to enjoy the visit.
I want to ask how much Dora
you - Mary thinks you can not
have bought all the lace for 30
& I do not think they were 30 each.
She & Elsie have decided they

must all go onto the front
of waist. & I think you will
like the effect. Mary says send
this back & ask if you can find
a little ^{enough like it} to go on to a ticked collar
& cuffs, & if not. We will put ~~on~~
a little blue (something) on collar
and leave it. I also want to ask
when you have time, to price
some Orib blankets. Little white
half wool ^{ones} with borders. I think
you can get them for about \$200. ^{\$250}
if so, get blue borders, and I'll send
on the money. They could be
sent from Trammakers to
come with a slip with my
name on. If they cost more
you may be able to get a single
one, instead of double ones.
